## World-class equestrian athletes converge on Sydney for the Equestrian Grand Final

Australia's top equestrian athletes are gearing up for the ultimate show-down at the inaugural Equestrian Grand Final at Sydney Showgrounds from 11-13 November 2011.

This is the only event in Australia that will bring together the elite athletes from all the Olympic disciplines of dressage, jumping and eventing as they battle it out for an attractive prize pool.

There will be an undoubted Olympic flavour to the Equestrian Grand Final, with former Olympic representatives and many of the 2012 Olympic hopefuls set to take centre stage.

One of the major attractions of the Equestrian Grand Final will be 'Exhibition Eventing' which is the fast, fun and testing modification to traditional eventing whereby it will be held on one day, in an arena format and will test the skills of our riders like never before.

This popular event is created specifically for spectator viewing and has attracted the best Aussie names in the sport including UK-based riders **Clayton Fredericks** (Olympic silver medallist, two time World Cup Champion and World Championships silver medallist), **Paul Tapner** (Badminton CCI4\* winner and World Games representative) and **Sam Griffiths** (World Games representative and placegetter at Badminton and Burghley CCI4\*s). This line up will provide a rare opportunity to see these overseas stars compete in Australia.

Couple this with Australian based stars **Stuart Tinney** (Olympic gold medallist); **Shane Rose** (Olympic silver medallist) and **Megan Jones** (Olympic silver medallist) and what you have is the biggest show down in eventing you'll see ahead of the 2012 Olympic Games.

Both the dressage and jumping line ups are equally impressive, with dressage queen **Rachel Sanna**, a former Olympic representative and 2012 hopeful, coming off the back of a successful National Championships where she made a clean sweep and took the trifecta of the grand Prix classes.

Australian Jumping Champion **Paul Athanasoff** and his magnificent stallion *Wirragulla Nicklaus* will be challenged by jumping legends **Chris Chugg** and **Vicki Roycroft** as well as many upcoming stars.

Held as part of EQUITANA Sydney, the largest equine tradeshow in the southern hemisphere, the Equestrian Grand Final is set to attract thousands of spectators across the three days of competition.

## Olympians geared up for the Equestrian Grand Final

**Sydney, 9 November 2011:** Australia's top equestrian athletes are ready to battle at the inaugural Equestrian Grand Final that is being held as part of EQUITANA at Sydney Showgrounds this Friday 11 – Sunday 13 November 2011.

The Equestrian Grand Final is the only event in Australia that will bring together elite athletes from all the Olympic disciplines of dressage, jumping and eventing as they battle it out for an attractive prize pool on offer.

Beijing silver medallist and winner of the Exhibition Eventing at the Sydney Royal Shane Rose, said this weekend will be a fun event that will give people a taste of Eventing.

“This event will be a good show piece for the sport – it will certainly provide the public with the essence of Eventing,” he said.

“I’m certainly going out there to win it! The horse I have is young in terms of experience but I think we’ll be competitive.”

Rose will go head to head with UK based riders Clayton Fredericks (Olympic silver medallist) riders Paul Tapner (Badminton CCI4\* winner) and Sam Griffiths (placegetter at Badminton and Burghley CCI4\*s). They’ll be joined by Australian based stars Stuart Tinney (Olympic gold medallist) and Megan Jones (Olympic silver medallist).

Veteran of the sport and Olympian Heath Ryan said the new Equestrian Grand Final is a great opportunity to open up the sport to new audiences.

“For our sport, we’ve been a little protected with well-educated audiences – but this event will be brilliant in opening it up to a new crowd which will be great exposure.

“This is an exciting event and has the potential to be a serious date on the competition calendar in the next couple of years.

“I’m actually trying out a new piece of music for the freestyle, which is a bit of a nightmare trying to get it right, but I’m excited,” he said.

After an impressive performance by Heath and Regardez Moi at the recent National Dressage Championships, they will be out to show selectors and audiences that they are serious contender for next year’s Olympic Games.

“Equitana is a great platform to get into a big arena after the Nationals and show that it wasn’t a fluke and that we are serious contenders for the team next year.

“I’d like to be at the Olympics next year. Making that team is what drives you as an athlete,” he said.

Three-time Olympian Vicki Roycroft, will be out to show the young guns she still has what it takes when she lines up with Karton De Breve on Friday night for the Jumping Grand Final.

“I’m looking forward to the competition. There is nothing better than jumping in front of a big crowd,” said Roycroft.

“He (Kartoon De Breve) competed at a high level in France – he’s a bit of a funny character, I’ve had him just under 12 months and he’s still a bit of a repair job,” she said.

Competition for the Equestrian Grand Final commences on Friday, with gates for the EQUITANA trade show due to open tomorrow. EQUITANA is the largest equine tradeshow in the southern hemisphere, with more than 50,000 people expected to pass through the gates over the four days.

# Dressage

Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2011 Dome Arena from 7:30 pm

## What is Dressage?

The word “dressage” is French for “training.” It is considered the classical foundation for all equestrian training. Dressage tests the ability of horse and rider to display both athletic prowess and supreme elegance. It is often compared to ballet. Dressage requires precision, technical excellence and harmony between horse and rider.

## The Basics

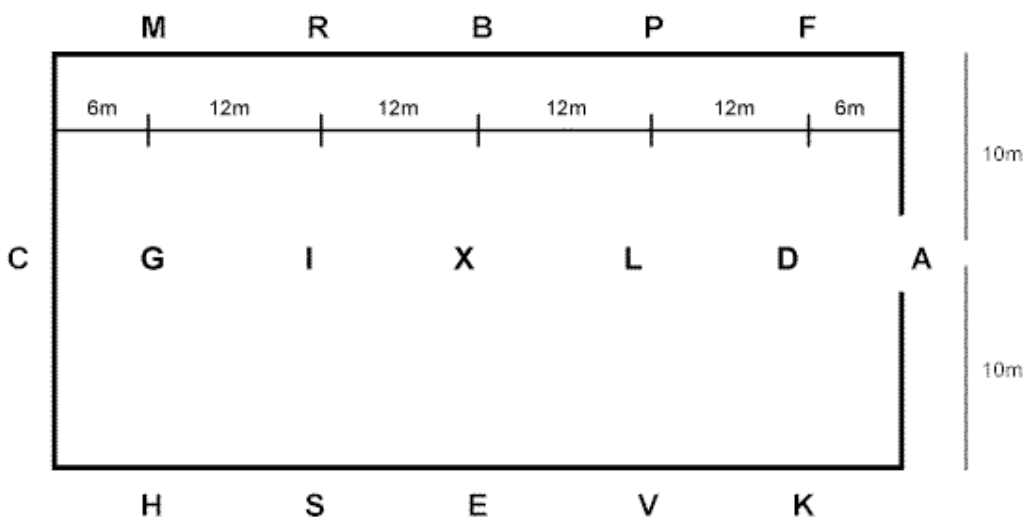
In modern dressage competitions, the horse and rider perform a set series of movements known as a Dressage “test”. The tests are performed in a 60m x 20m arena before a panel of seven judges, who award marks out of 10 for individual movements and for the overall routine.

The highest level of the sport is known as Grand Prix. On average it takes between 6 and 8 years to get a dressage horse to the Grand Prix level. Grand Prix horses usually range in age from 10 years to 20 years. Warmblood horses are the most popular breed for dressage due to their athletic aptitude for the sport, including extravagant paces, power and temperament.

There are three “tests” at Grand Prix level, the Grand Prix, the Grand Prix Special and the Grand Prix Freestyle, also known as the “Kür”. In the Grand Prix and the Grand Prix Special, all riders and horses perform a set test. Only the best performed combinations go on to compete in the Freestyle.

The Freestyle is a favourite for the spectators as it allows riders to choreograph their own routines set to their choice of music. The scores in the Freestyle decide the winners of the individual competition.

*Below is a 60m x20m Dressage arena. The horses and riders enter at A . The letters mark where the “movements” must be performed. Riders must memorise the test. A Grand Prix test consists of 33 movements.*



## Dressage Grand Final

Fifteen of Australia's best Grand Prix Dressage riders and horses have qualified to compete in the Equestrian Grand Final – Dressage. These horse and rider combinations performed a Grand Prix test on Friday from which the top 12 have progressed to Saturday night's Freestyle competition.

The Freestyle is a favourite for the spectators as it allows riders to choreograph their own routines set to their choice of music.

The Australian team recently qualified for the 2012 Olympic Games and now the battle is really on between the riders to claim one of the coveted Olympic team places - so expect a fierce competition.

## How did the athletes qualify?

The selection of athletes for this event was via a series of five qualifying events conducted Australia-wide. These are significant dressage events in their own right and each held a Grand Prix Freestyle.

From the five qualifying events, the twelve combinations with the highest percentages (from the Grand Prix Freestyle) automatically qualified for the Final. Wildcard places were also awarded to make up the remaining places for this year's Grand Final. The qualification events included;

# Jumping

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> November 2011 Dome Arena from 7:30 pm

## What is Jumping?

Jumping requires horse and rider to navigate a course of jumps that fall if knocked, resulting in penalties thus demanding precision, speed and perfect technique. Prepare to be spell bound by the power and agility of these horses.

Jumping is a very exciting spectator sport with riders pushing the limits of speed and ability. Fifteen Grand Prix Jumping riders and horses will compete in the Equestrian Grand Final. Jumping riders must be incredibly measured and accurate, even under the enormous pressure of a jump-off. The smallest mistake can be very expensive.

Spectators will be very close to the action in the spectacular indoor Dome arena - adding to the edge-of-your-seat experience.

The highest level in Jumping is 5-Star Grand Prix. At this level the maximum height of a vertical jump is 1.60m and maximum width of a spread (triple bar) can be 2.20m. At the Equestrian Grand Final you can expect the jump-off course to include 1.60m fences.

Jumping was the first equestrian discipline included at an Olympic Games.

## The Basics

Held in an arena around a short course containing 12-14 fences, the event requires huge reserves of boldness, accuracy and nerves of steel, from both the riders and their horses.

Combinations are penalised for jumping faults and time exceeded over the optimum time. In a "jump-off" the fastest clear round wins.

Jumping is a very exciting spectator sport with riders pushing the limits of speed and ability.

## Jargon buster

**Clear round:** A round without any faults.

**Fault:** Penalty points awarded for making a mistake: for instance, knocking down a jump or exceeding the allotted time.

**Jump-off:** If one or more riders are tied for first place after the final scheduled round, there may be an extra round of competition, known as a jump-off which is ridden against the clock.

**Refusal:** When a horse stops at a jump, incurring faults.

### How did the athletes qualify?

The athletes and horses who qualified for this year's event had to battle it out through a series of five qualifying events conducted Australia-wide. From these events, the top three placed combinations qualified for the Final. Equestrian Australia reserved the right to allocate additional wildcard places for the Final. These qualification events were;

# Exhibition Eventing

Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2011 Dome Arena from 4:30 pm

## What is Exhibition Eventing?

Fourteen of Australia's best Eventing riders will compete in the Equestrian Grand Final – Exhibition Eventing.

This will be a fast paced event testing the finesse, bravery and accuracy of horse and rider. Australia has enjoyed enormous Olympic success in eventing and it would not be a true Equestrian Grand Final if eventing was not included. Therefore, a modified version of the sport has been created to capture the spirit and skill of eventing in an arena environment.

This format has been especially designed with extensive input by leading riders as well as international course designer, Wayne Copping.

It is fast, it is fun and it will test the skills of these talented horses and riders.

This event welcomes the highest profile start-list of any event held in this country since the 2000 Olympic Games. We will welcome UK-based riders Clayton Fredericks (Olympic silver medallist, two time World Cup Champion and World Championships silver medallist), Paul Tapner (Badminton CCI4\* winner and World Games representative) and Sam Griffiths (World Games representative and placegetter at Badminton and Burghley CCI4\*s).

Coupled with Australian-based stars Stuart Tinney (Olympic gold medallist), Shane Rose (Olympic silver medallist) and Megan Jones (Olympic silver medallist) and you have a line-up of the big guns in eventing. It doesn't get any better than this.

Don't miss this rare opportunity to watch our overseas based stars compete on Australian soil.

The components of the Exhibition Eventing will be run as follows;

- Dressage (3-star level) will be held first and the riders will be seeded by their dressage results.
- The Jumping will be run in reverse order of standing.
- The jumping will be one course combining cross-country and show jumps.
- The cross-country fences will be solid fences of up to 2-star dimensions max height 1.15m (fixed) and 1.35m (brush). The show jumps will be up to 3-star dimensions (1.25m). There will be an optional joker fence of up to 1.45m (show jump). Jumped clear, the joker fence wipes 4 penalties from the riders score.
- The rider who wins the dressage will start the jumping on a score of 0. Whilst the rider placed 2nd will carry forward 2 penalties, 3rd will carry 3 penalties and so on.
- In the jumping phase rides incur penalties for knocking down rails and/or exceeding the time limit.
- The rider with the least penalties at the end is the winner.

Our UK-based riders are riding borrowed horses in this event.

## How did the athletes qualify?

Two qualifying events were held for Exhibition Eventing. From these two qualifying events the top four riders automatically qualified for the final. The remaining places were awarded as wild cards. The qualifying events were:

19 April 2011, Sydney Royal Easter Show Exhibition Eventing class

30 September 2011, Melbourne Royal Show Exhibition Eventing class
