Rule 2.2	The Organising Committee will appoint a Steward for National Championships which must be ratified by the National Vaulting Committee. The Steward may also be a member of the Ground Jury. The Steward is responsible for advising the President of the Ground Jury of satisfaction with the arrangements at the commencement of the jurisdiction of the Ground Jury. This application must be sent to vaultingjudgesaustralia@gmail.com The application will then be processed by the Downgrading Sub Committee. Please allow two weeks for processing. Athletes seeking to regain their previous grade must notify the Judges panel of their intention to recommence their previous grade. Athletes in possession of downgrading approvals, must forward a copy of approval granted in the current calendar year with their entries to any event they enter. If a competitor is entered in a class level below their previously entered level without a downgrading approval they will be disqualified. If Organising Committees are not in possession of a copy of the downgrading approval before the start of the event the entrant should be offered the HC option
