For the purpose of this article, the term "entourage" shall mean the Person Responsible's parent, spouse or partner, family member, coach, trainer, groom, crew or other person directly connected with the Person Responsible and includes the owner(s) of the Person Responsible's Horse. - Non-compliance with applicable Sport Rules - Non-compliance with Protective Headgear Rules <p>(b) The Yellow Warning Card may be delivered either by hand or by any other suitable means.
