## **Presenters:**

Presenters are those endorsed by the EAJC after, in either order, submitting an EOI form and attending a Train the Trainer Day conducted by EAJC'S representative.

## **Role of the Presenters:**

Presenters are to have a sound a current understanding of Course Design. Be current EA Members, hold and maintain EA National Jumping Course Design accreditation and be a minimum EA Level 3 Course Designer and have a proven background in the sport. They must have knowledge of the Course Designer Syllabus from Level 1 to Level 3 depending on their accreditation and the assessment tools used to assess candidates.

Presenters are to supervise the written examinations, provide assessment and confidential feedback to participants.

Send a clinic Summary report to the relevant State Branch and National Office of EA with the names of the participants who have successfully passed the theory examination for consideration for promotion.





# At conclusion of Level 3 Clinic:

Presenters are to supervise the written examinations, provide assessment and confidential feedback to participants.

Send a clinic Summary report to EA and EAJC with the names of the participants who have successfully passed the theory examination. The EAJC will then consider the practical experience requirements for any upgrades.
