

OUR NEW COACHING ACCREDITATION PATHWAY INCLUDES FOUR LEVELS OF ACCREDITATION

- **Recreational Coach;** targeted primarily to club level coaches and teachers who wish to deliver the basic skills of horse riding.
- **Competition Coach;** targeted to the lower levels of competition and intermediate skills of horse riding.
- **Senior Competition Coach;** targeted at the middle levels of competition and advanced skills of horse riding.
- **High Performance Coach;** targeted to the international levels of competition and high performance requirements for horse riding.

PATHWAY REQUIREMENTS

CORE PRINCIPLES

Comprise of theoretical concepts required for Horse Management, Riding and Coaching and will be offered on an online platform. It will include videos, downloadable resources, quizzes, assessment tasks and the functionality to upload completed documents.

DISCIPLINES ELECTIVES

Enable the practical application of the theory. This will include guided lessons, mentoring, a breakdown of lesson components and feedback on your coaching technique.

ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES

Provide additional modules for coaches to access further professional development opportunities. This includes discipline specific and equestrian specific modules, as well as modules to enhance business skills and additional coaching skills. The aim is to add new modules each year and therefore grow the learning opportunities available through the pathway.
