

High Performance Jumping Clinic

Dear Squad Rider,

Congratulations on your recent inclusion on a National Recognition Squad. You are cordially invited to attend the following clinic:

Date: 17-22 March 2015

Venue: Yandoo Park, Ebenezer, NSW.

The cost of the sessions is \$100 per lesson with a commitment to 3 lessons over the 3 days (a total of \$300 per combination) with an additional cost of \$20 per horse, per day for the ground fee.

The group size will be a maximum of 4 and if we can accommodate the groups will be only 3 combinations and are split into the following groups:

17-19 March

- Senior - 1.30m, 1.40+. 12 places available in total for the 3 days (New Squad combinations given first preference)
- Young Rider - 12 places available in total for the 3 days (New Squad combinations given first preference)

20-22 March

- Young Horses - 1.10-1.30m. 12 places available in total for the 3 days (Futures Squad combinations given first preference)
- Generation Next Group (by appointment) will be committed to 3 days.

Please note that the times and dates may vary closer to the clinic time, depending on numbers and levels of combinations.

Clinic Trainer: Oliver Lazarus

Early exposure in the UK since the age of 14 years has helped Oliver to win many coveted classes (twice winning the Future at Scope Championships and Young Rider Championships at Hickstead).

At 15 years he had the wonderful opportunity to train and work with Ludger Beerbaum. Upon finishing his education at the age of 17 Oliver headed to Ludgers where he developed his craft over the next 7 plus years.

At 18 years of age Oliver qualified for the Olympics but South Africa were not in a position to help the process to get there. Oliver has been to the World Equestrian games on two occasions, Kentucky, with the horse Silver Spring, gaining a place in the final 35 and then Normandy, with the brave Pour Le Passage placing 25th overall. He has also been fortunate to compete at most of the top European shows up to 5* for many seasons.

Oliver knows what it takes to develop through the ranks and has a lot to offer recognition squad riders and those aiming to reach the top level of the sport.

As a professional show jumper he can only stress: 'this is indeed a tough life to choose, but a life I could never ever change or want to. The qualities needed are (to name a few): work ethic, talent (it helps)!, tenacity, humour and above all humility.'
