The following are proposed Jumping rule changes to become effective 1st January 2019

Rule	Heading	Justification	Revised Rule
EA National Jumping Rules; Article 282	Athletes and Horses	Due to some state branches not following procedures to update competition licenses so that correct points are allocated – The EAJC believe this will make it clearer what is required of athletes and of the state branches.	<p>Article 282 Athletes and Horses</p> <p>Athletes, Owners and Horses must meet the requirements set out in the EA General Regulations as per the type and level of Competition they are participating in. Full Horse registration will automatically give the Horse an official points total, a Competition name and a competition number. It is the Athlete's responsibility to have the Horse's Identity Papers and Competition License at all Events where they are competing. The Judge or their representative can request an Athlete to produce these at any Event where the horse is competing. Where a Horse is placed in a Competition the Horse's Competition License must be presented to the Judge at the prize giving ceremony.</p> <p>Horse Competition Licenses must be returned to the relevant State Office at annual renewal time to be validated by the State Office against the data base.</p> <p>Article 283</p> <p>6. Competition License</p> <p>6.1 The President of the Ground Jury or their delegate, Athlete/owner are to enter all details and sign the current competition license for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places, prior to prize money being awarded. All unsigned and non-validated points will remain on the horse's performance card and will be recorded as Athlete declared points. These points will be added to the data base at annual renewal time by the relevant state body. Valid Competition licenses are the responsibility of owners and/or Athletes to be true and correct.</p>
