

Minimum Medical Response Requirements (MMRR) for Jumping Competition



Effective 1 January 2026

Organising Committees are encouraged to provide the highest practical level of support for their competition but must provide minimum medical support levels as detailed below. Requirements are based on the number of riders entered per day.

Competitors must be advised of the level of medical support available at the show on the event entry form.

1. On site medical personnel as detailed in the table below must be available during the hours of competition and official training periods.
2. A suitable communication system must be established to notify medical services of incidents.
3. To determine the required level of medical support organisers must make reasonable estimates of the numbers of entries expected based on historical or other data.
4. If the medical service is unable to respond to an incident competition should be paused.
5. In larger shows Organising Committees should position and plan for sufficient medical support such that a 3-minute response time can be expected.
6. Volunteers may be used to provide the medical service provided they are qualified, rostered for specific time periods where that is their primary role and properly equipped.

Tier	Rider Numbers/Day	Minimum Medical Requirement
Tier 1	<40	<p>A first Aid Service must always be present including personnel with current HLTAID01 (includes CPR) qualification or equivalent.</p> <p>Personnel must be able and willing to identify suspected concussion using available tools and be willing to clear or preclude a rider from further competition after a fall.</p> <p>They must have an “in date” first aid kit</p>
Tier 2	41–100	<p>An advanced first responder qualified as below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HLTAID014 (Advanced First Aid), • HLTAID015 (Advanced Resuscitation), <p>+ appropriate equipment</p>
Tier 3	>100	<p>1 x AHPRA Registered Health Practitioner with Advanced Life Support skills and Equipment and (to make a team of two)</p> <p>1 x Basic Life Support First Responder</p>
