An Official for the purpose of issuing a Yellow Warning Card or Recorded Warning Card may be any of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> An FEI or National accredited Steward An EA Technical Delegate An EA State or National Judge <p>See Rule 1.5 and 1.6: Protests, Reports, Appeals, Recorded and Yellow Warning Cards. Yellow Warning Cards following a meeting with the party concerned at the event may be issued on the day and when being awarded by an EA Official, should ideally be delivered personally to the rider/ owner/ exhibitor/ member, together with an explanation as to why it is being issued and the possible consequences of any further offences being committed. In the case of a rider being under the age of 18 years, a Parent/Guardian must be present when personally delivering the Yellow Warning Card. Where a rider receives two or more Yellow Warning Cards within a 12-month period for the same offence the State Branch will prepare a report for referral to the EA Branch for consideration under the Disciplinary Bylaws/General Regulations. If after reasonable efforts the rider cannot be notified during the period of the event that they have received a Yellow Warning Card, the rider must be notified within 14 (fourteen) days of the event.</p> <p>Yellow Warning Cards received at both International and National events will be taken into account.</p> </div>
