	Preamble	To make Preamble clearer	PREAMBLE (Please note under review) The following rules have been adopted by the Equestrian Australia (EA) and must be followed by all affiliated organizations conducting vaulting events on behalf of the EA or under EA Rules. They follow the rules laid down by the Federation Equestrian Internationale (FEI) and are intended to provide a pathway to International Competition. The FEI rules are updated from time to time and undergo a major review every 4 years. Changes to FEI rules usually occur effective 1st January and are available on the FEI website. Any changes to these rules will be advised on the EA website by January 1st each year to take effect 1st April of that year. If issues arise which are not be covered in these rules, then the FEI rules apply. In the event of a conflict between the EA rules and the FEI rules, the EA rules will prevail. These rules cannot provide for every eventuality. In any unforseen or exceptional circumstances, it is the duty of the appropriate Official (s) to make a decision in a sporting spirit and adhere as closely as possible to the intention of these rules. Notwithstanding anything stipulated in these rules, the EA National Vaulting Committee (NVC) shall have full and complete authority to omit, amend and interrupt these rules in their absolute discretion and give or to withhold any explanation of their decision. These rules must be followed at Official competitions. At Non- official competitions these rules maybe followed as a guideline and be aimed at encouraging fun and increased participation. Inclusion of fun recreational classes at these events is strongly encouraged, some suggestions for other classes are provided at the end of the document.

		To make Preamble clearer	PREMABLE (Please note under review) These rules are the property of Equestrian Australia (EA) and must be adhered to by all affiliated organizations conducting vaulting competitions on behalf of the EA or under EA Rules. They follow the rules laid down by the Federation Equestrian Internationale (FEI). The FEI rules and guidelines are updated from time to time and undergo a major review every 4 years. Changes to the FEI rules and guidelines are available on the FEI website. Any changes to the FEI rules and guidelines that are relevant to the EA National Vaulting Rules will be published on the EA website to take effect 3 months after the publication date by the FEI on their website. A guideline to the changes to the EA National Vaulting Rules will be made available on the EA website after the annual EA Vaulting judges forum and approval by the EAVC. If matters arise on which the EA rules are silent, then the FEI rules apply. In the event of a conflict between the EA rules and the FEI rules, the EA rules will prevail for Australian competitions Rules cannot cover every eventuality. Where a matter arises not covered by the EA or FEI rules, the appropriate competition Official (s) will be guided in their decision by the spirit of the sport and the intent of the EA and FEI rules. The EA National Vaulting Committee (EAVC) has the authority to omit, amend and suspend any EA rule at their discretion and give or withhold an explanation of their decision.

Rule 4.2, page 13			Lunge rein and Lungeing whip. Lunge rein must be attached to the inner ring of the bit (not over the head or to the outer ring of the bit) or at the lunge cavesson. Bandages and/or brushing/overreach boots are optional. Ear muffs and plugs are allowed. Back Pad is compulsory. Gel Pads are allowed. Maximum width of weight bearing flat face of surcingle to be no greater than 180mm. 3. Maximum distance between the right hand side and left hand side surcingle handles 240mm. 4. Maximum distance between the centre of the top and bottom fixing points on surcingle handles 280mm. Note these are the maximum dimensions, smaller dimensions are acceptable and a tolerance of 20mm will be accepted. • Lunge rein must be attached to the inner ring of the bit (not over the head or to the outer ring of the bit) or at the lunge cavesson. • Bandages and/or brushing/overreach boots are optional. • Ear hoods and plugs are allowed.
